Frequently Asked Questions

I can't make it to a lecture or seminar, what should I do?

Email the lecturer or seminar leader, copying in the administration department, and explain that you won't be attending. You will then need to complete an absence form and hand it in to the administration department with supporting evidence. If you are experiencing difficulties on a regular basis then please contact your personal advisor to discuss this.

I have a question about my course, who should I contact?

Email your lecturer or seminar leader if the question can be resolved over email. Alternatively, you can arrange to see that member of staff during their office hours to discuss your question.

Is attendance to lectures and seminars compulsory?

Attendance at all lectures and seminars is compulsory. If you need to miss a lecture or seminar then please follow the absence procedure. Attendance at all lectures and seminars is monitored and there is a minimum expected attendance level of 80%.

Can I choose which seminar group I attend?

No. Seminar groups are automatically allotted. You should always arrange medical appointments etc. for a time when you do not have any lectures or seminars timetabled. If, however, you have an unavoidable appointment you can email your seminar leader, copying in the administration department, requesting to join a different seminar group for one week only. You must make sure you sign the correct register to prove your attendance. If you have not got permission prior to attending a different seminar this will be classed as an unauthorised absence. If you have extenuating circumstances that mean you will not be able to attend the seminar you have been allotted to then please visit the administration department as soon as possible.

Are all assignments compulsory?

Yes, it is imperative that you hand in all assignments, whether they are formative or summative, as failure to do so may mean that you are unable to sit your exams and progress to the next year.

Can I hand an essay in late?

All essays (both the paper copies and the submission to Turnitin) are expected to be in before the deadline set. If you have a valid reason for being unable to complete an essay on time please visit the administration department BEFORE the essay is due bringing any supporting evidence with you and an extension may be considered. If you have not been granted an extension and you submit your essay late then a penalty will be applied. If the essay is submitted up to 24 hours after the deadline 10 percentage marks will be deducted from the final mark, if the essay is submitted over 24 hours past the deadline then you will automatically receive a zero for that assignment.

I am struggling with the course or with adjusting to university life, is there anyone I can talk to?

Your personal tutor should always be your first port of call for any troubles you are facing at university. If for some reason you cannot talk to your personal tutor the administration team are always happy to help to try and assist with any problems you may be encountering. The administration team can also organise for you to talk to someone from the University's counselling service, or you can go directly to them to discuss your difficulties.
