Therefore, this article brings 7 free-access places to study on campus whether your source of concentration is in a strictly silent, normally silent but not voice-restricted, or noise-involved environment.

1. Library



No need for verbosity as it is already well-known. This is the most popular study space on campus providing plenty of slots for both silent and social zone, and other amenities including a café, a convenience store, books to be borrowed, whiteboards, computers, printers, and allocatable private rooms. Here can be considered as a starter kit for all RHUL students.

2. Recharge Zone



This zone located on the ground floor of the Windsor Building, has just been introduced this year. It is aimed to be another social zone, but it is normally somehow quiet. Apart from the collaboration space, there are 2 microwaves to heat your meal during your day out. Only bring your lunchboxes along, you can stay here for the whole day!

3. Reading Room



A big noiseless room with a knowledgeable mood can help to sharpen your mind while you need somewhere peaceful to study alone. You can find it close to Herringham room B in Founders West.

4. Computer Centre



This is another hidden gem where not many people visit. This place provides phone charging stations, printers, and computers whereas it is a bit difficult to find a clear table if you do not want to use a computer.

5. Shilling Building



The common area in this building of Electronic Engineering is well-decorated and pleasurable. Although not many extra types of equipment are present like the others, surely, just the atmosphere is attractive enough for a co-working zone.

6. Imagine



Some people do not know that this place exists in the basement of The Hub although it is one of the popular places for socialisation. During the study, you can order a glass of boba and sip all day.

7. Desk Allocations



Some PGR students automatically have a desk allocated in their schools, for example, allocated desks for EPMS students are on the top floor of the Bedford Building. This is a great option for those who would like to see other PGR students from the same school.
