2. PGR Student Dashboard

In your role as supervisor, if you are not already a user, you may find the student record interface system (Dashboard), an invaluable tool. Not only can you access information about students you supervise (e.g. annual review details, funding and current supervisory team information), but you can also access tracking information about groups of students by supervisor, department or School. All of this information is updated daily so information will be current and with speedy access at your fingertips.

3. PRES (Postgraduate Research Experience Survey) 2023

The <u>Postgraduate Research Experience Survey (PRES)</u> is a national survey of postgraduate researchers conducted by institutions across the UK and globally which allows the College to compare how we are doing with other institutions, to make changes that will improve what we do in future, and to keep doing the things that our postgraduate researchers value.

This year's survey was launched on 15 March and remains open until 15 May. Could you please encourage your supervisees to complete this survey (should take approx. 15 minutes) so that we can ensure the full range of our PGR community's views are represented. Engagement updates will be sent out to Directors of PGR Education and Department PGR Leads in mid April and the beginning of May.

4. PGR Career Enhancing Placement Scheme

As part of the <u>PGR Career Enhancing Placement Scheme</u>, we have recently launched four new, exciting PGR placement opportunities:

- 1. <u>Archive Assistant at Royal Holloway's Library</u>: opportunity to help make Royal Holloway's archival collections accessible to broad audiences, supporting their use in teaching, research and public engagement.
- 2. <u>Curatorial Assistant at Royal Holloway:</u> opportunity to help make Royal Holloway's art collections accessible to broad audiences, supporting their use in teaching, research and public engagement
- 3. <u>History of Parliament Trust and the UK Parliamentary Archives PhD placement:</u> opportunity to work with the History of Parliament Trust and the UK Parliamentary Archives on a project to explore the place and future of Parliamentary history in the GCSE curriculum, helping to convene a working group of experts to identify new perspectives on the history of Parliament as it currently features in exam board specifications and, informed by the latest scholarship, potential new topics that could inform future specifications.
- 4. <u>Give a Book charity PhD placement</u>: <u>Give a Book</u> is a registered charity established to provide books and promote the pleasure of reading in the hardest places. This placement provides an opportunity to take a closer look at what books can do behind bars.

All these placements are funded, and time taken away from research to do the placement is reflected in an extended submission deadline. If you think any of these would provide your supervisee with invaluable career-enhancing experience, please do encourage them to apply.
