

How to use our Personal Statement Review Service:

As always, we want to help your students improve their personal statements and reduce the stress that this element of a university application can bring. This year, instead of traditional personal statement surgeries where we meet with students in person, we are encouraging students to use our <u>Online Personal Statement Review Service</u>.

Students can easily upload a draft of their personal statement and will be given feedback within 5 days from one of our team. We will provide advice on what they have done well and what they can develop upon in their draft statements, giving them hints and tips on how to improve. It's all explained in our short video here. Feel free to distribute the link to the video and/or the service itself to your students.

Flexible admissions for 2021 undergraduate entry

In light of the fact that exams will no longer go ahead this year, we would like to reassure students that we will be offering flexible admissions for 2021 undergraduate entry. We guarantee that students holding an offer, will have their place confirmed, even if one of their final A-level (or equivalent) grades is one grade below their UCAS offer. Contextual offer

Our contextual offer is a reduction of up to 2 grades lower* compared to the original entry requirements advertised on our website and undergraduate prospectus.

*Subject specific grades and GCSEs are not part of the contextual offer

Who is eligible?

Students must meet 2 Widening Access criteria, which are:

- Attend an aspiring school (available on our <u>website</u>)
- Have a disability or health condition that impacts daily life
- Been in local authority care fro more than 3 months
- Mature student (21 or over at time of course start)
- Parents/carers have not attended a university
- Home postcode is in a POLAR 4 Q1 area (you can search on our <u>website</u>)

How do students apply?

They do nothing extra.

- Just make Royal Holloway one of their 5 choices on UCAS when they apply
- Ensure their application is as complete and accurate as possible: we look at specific pieces of data
- If they meet the course entry requirements and the Widening Access criteria, we will do the rest
- 4. The offer they receive will be a contextual one
