Tribute to Ruth David, Bedford alumna and Holocaust educator (1929-2020) By Bedford Society Committee member Jennifer Glastonbury (BA French with German, 1969)

I first became aware of Ruth David in January when I saw her interviewed on a TV documentary for the 75th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz. She was an impressive interviewee, radiating wisdom and intelligence. It was only later that I discovered she was a Bedford alumna! She had come to England aged 10 on the Kindertransport from Germany, and spent most of the second World War living in a refugee hostel in Windemere. Her parents died in the gas chambers of Auschwitz in 1942. From 1947 to 1950, she studied languages at Bedford College, having won a Reid scholarship, and she took a degree in French. **Read more**.
