By the end of this course students should be able to communicate with simple sentences, read and write 200-300 Chinese characters. They should also have a general understanding of Chinese culture.
 Revision and consolidation 	The students have the opportunity to take HSK 1/2 or equivalent at RHUL or other colleges of the University of London.
