


## Q4 How important, if at all, do you think it is that Royal Holloway takes action to use and promote Fairtrade products?



## Q5 When you have a choice, how often do you buy a product with the Fairtrade label over a product without?







# Q6 When, if at all, did you last make a buying decision that was specifically influenced by the the ethical standards of a retailer or producer?







