This year you are warmly invited to the Eleventh Annual Memorial to our teacher and former Director, <u>Julian Chrysostomides</u> (1928-2008). As part of this event, Great Vespers and a Memorial Service officiated by our parish priest Father Asterios and a Memorial Speech by Professor Evangelos Chrysos, will be held in <u>Royal Holloway College Chapel</u>, Egham, Surrey on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> October 2019, 4.00-5.30pm. We are also pleased to invite you to our Eighteenth Annual Hellenic Lecture "The Power of Logos: Classical Greek Rhetoric and the Modern World" by Professor Michael Edwards. In 2016, the then President of the United States, Barack Obama, delivered a speech at the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Cultural Center in Athens, in which he praised Greece's contribution to humanity through the ages. In the course of his speech Obama spoke, among other things, about the concept, ideals and importance of democracy, and the belief in equality before the law for all. In his lecture Professor Edwards will discuss these themes, illustrating them by comparisons of ancient texts with modern examples drawn from American, British and Greek political contexts. The Lecture will take place in <u>Moore Building Auditorium</u>, Royal Holloway, Egham, Surrey on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> March 2020 at 6.15pm, to be followed by drinks. We look forward to seeing you and your family and friends to these events.

Last October we celebrated the closing of our 25th Anniversary with the premiere of the specially commissioned choral piece "Odyssey", composed by our College alumna and Friend of the Hellenic Institute, Lydia Kakabadse, and performed by The Choir of Royal Holloway in the College Chapel. You will be pleased to know that Lydia's "Odyssey", recorded by The Choir of Royal Holloway, has been included in her new CD album "Ithaka" to be released by Divine Art on 15th November 2019.
