Community Action Project 'Selling to Both Sides' Research Volunteers

Aim: Their aim is to improve opportunities for people to participate in heritage and cultural activities, amplify and preserve the voices of those who are hidden histories, build respect between, for example, older and younger people, newly arrived and settled people, use oral history in new and unusual settings both within the heritage sector and beyond

Roles: They are recruiting research volunteers for the project 'Selling to Both Sides'. The role will include finding relevant archival sources and using them to uncover case studies using written, photographic and oral evidence. These case studies will contribute to a dedicated website on arms sales during the First World War. Additionally, the role could also include taking part in discussions with young people about the material you have uncovered, and recording these discussions, or the results of your own research, as a podcast for use on a dedicated website.

Training: There is an induction on the 25 February

Location: Varies

Times: For a eight week period they want an 8 day commitment (only March - April 2014). The research needs to be carried out mainly Monday - Saturday when the archives and libraries are open.

DBS: A DBS check is not required for this role
