Action Tutoring

Community Action Partner

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Aim: Action Tutoring provides volunteer tutors to work with pupils in inner city schools preparing for GCSE exams in English and Maths, particularly focusing on pupils on the D/C borderline. Volunteers work with pupils for an hour a week for 6-8 weeks, based at a school. Action Tutoring aims to help more pupils leave school with 5 A*-C grade GCSEs including English and Maths, to increase their chances of going on to further education, employment or training. Action Tutoring ask that volunteers have an A or B grade at A Level or equivalent in the subject they are wishing to tutor. Volunteers need to be enthusiastic about the subject they are tutoring and able to take the initiative. Experience of working with young people is helpful but not essential.

Role: Volunteer tutors work with 2 pupils for 8 weeks, for one hour a week. Pupils are on the C/D borderline in GCSE Maths or English. Tutors will support them with the aim of helping them achieve a C or better. Achieving this grade will improve their future prospects.

Training: A training session will take place at the school before tutoring starts. Action Tutoring will provide materials and the school will provide information about the pupils.

Location: Action Tutoring works with schools around London and will endeavour to place volunteers in a school that is most convenient for them.

Times: Tutors will do one session a week for 8 weeks. Mondays (8.30am, 3.30 or 3.10) Tuesdays (3.30, 3.20 or 3) Wednesdays (8.45am, 9.40am, 2.30, 3.10 3.15, 3.30, 5) Thursdays (1.30, 5. 3.30) Fridays (TBC) Saturdays (10am , 11am) Saturdays

DBS: A DBS is required for this role via Community Action.



All project volunteers must be registered as Community Action Volunteers.
