Aim: Cancer Research UK is the world's leading independent organisation dedicated to cancer research. They carry out scientific research to help prevent, diagnose and treat cancer. Role:

Action Team Member: Cancer Research UK has Action Teams around the country to help with our fundraising. You'll be supporting the work of the Volunteer Fundraising department, the team working with our supporters who are fundraising in their community.

We need you to assist at events organised by our fundraising groups such as dog walks and balls, as well as collecting money for Cancer Research UK at public events or at street collections. There may also be ad-hoc opportunities to help the volunteer fundraising team on a particular campaign, or cheering on our runners at a sports event. This is a great opportunity for event experience and to develop networking skills within the community.

Training: An Area Manager from Cancer Research UK will meet with the volunteer to discuss volunteering and answer any questions. A staff partner within the charity will offer support and guidance to the volunteer throughout and supply the committee with necessary materials.

Location: Various locations, but much of your work will be within London.

Times: Flexible

CRB: No CRB check is required for the role.
