Aim: Young Enterprise is a national charity which specialises in providing enterprise education to primary and secondary school students. They run a large range of business-education based programmes through the support of business volunteers and local businesses/corporates. Best known for the Company Programme, where students set up and run a real business over the course of an academic year, from Start-Up to Liquidation, supported by a volunteer Business Adviser. Over 2200 companies participated in this programme last year and over 250,000 pupils/students and 5000 volunteers took part in their activities.

Role: Volunteers are trained to deliver enterprise and entrepreneurship education programmes in schools and act as positive role models for pupils and students in the South East. They will facilitate with the delivery of the programme content along with trained Young Enterprise staff. On completion of the programme they will be asked to evaluate their experience.

Training: Volunteers will receive an induction to Young Enterprise along with full training sessions before being given a programme to help deliver, with ongoing support from Young Enterprise staff.

Location: Various Surrey and South East School Locations.

Times: Weekdays, school hours (Approx 8am until 4pm).

CRB: A CRB disclosure may be required via Young Enterprise for Young Enterprise Company Programmes.

Other: A CRB check being passed and English speaking is essential.
